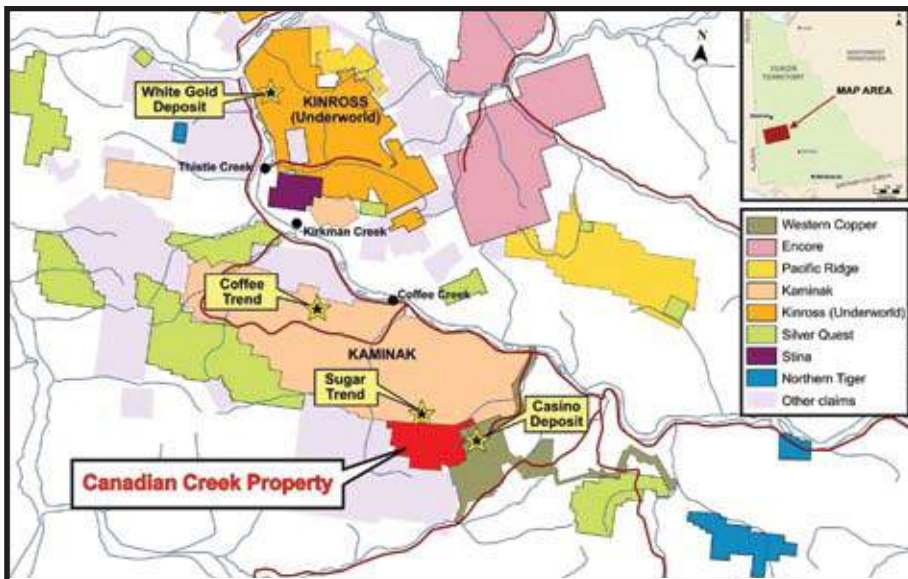
Cariboo Rose Resources Limited is a Canadian public resource company which is an incubator of early stage gold and copper exploration projects with a special focus on the Yukon and the Quesnel Terrane of British Columbia. The company's business model involves the acquisition of early stage quality projects and then finding partners to fund exploration. The benefit to investors is that this minimizes risk and increases leverage. A recent example of the success of this business model is the spin-out to shareholders of Consolidated Woodjam Copper Corp. (TSX-V: WCC).

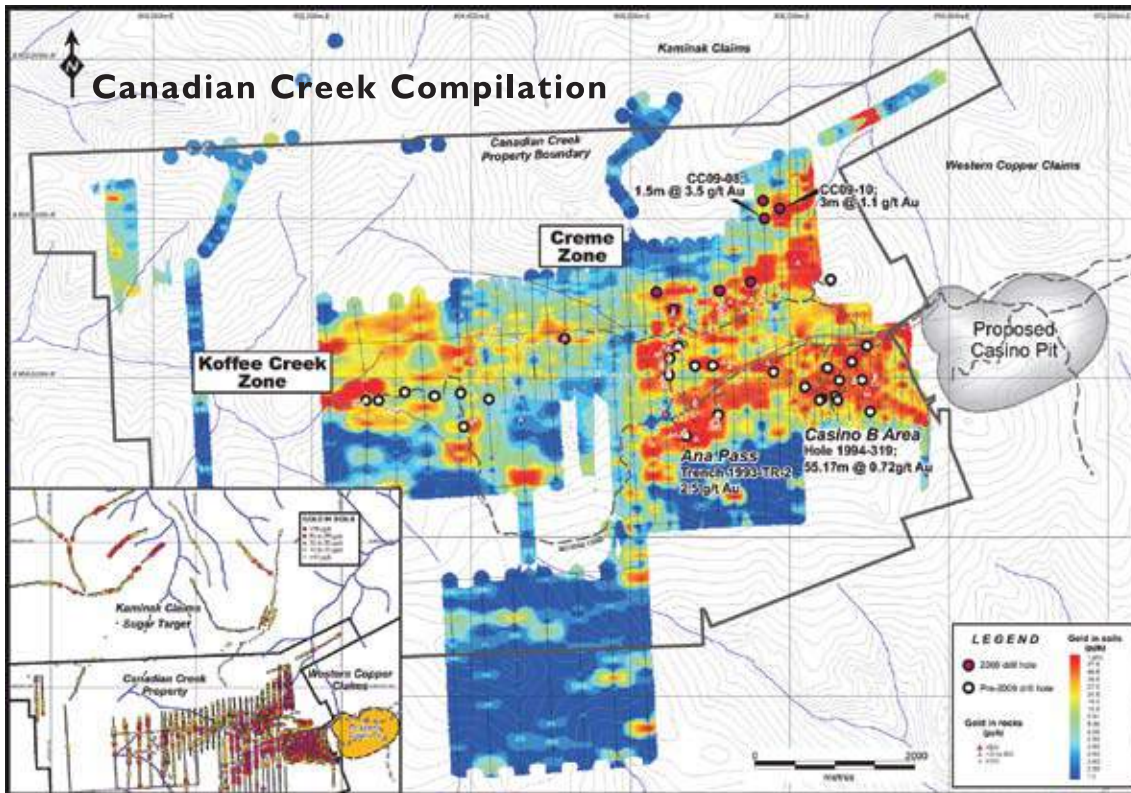

OUR PROJECTS

Canadian Creek - Copper, Gold and Molybdenum

- ✓ The 6,180 hectare Canadian Creek property is strategically located adjacent to Western Copper's Casino deposit.
- ✓ Canadian Creek contains porphyry gold, copper and molybdenum mineralization in several holes.
- ✓ Drill Highlight: Hole 07-04 cored 0.31 g/t gold (with 516 ppm copper and 15 ppm Mo) over 139.9 metres including 2.96 g/t gold over 6.0 metres.

Carruthers Pass - Copper, Zinc, Silver and Gold

- ✓ The 3,250 hectare Carruthers Pass property is located in BC approximately 70 km south of the Kemsess gold-copper mine.
- ✓ Massive Sulphide mineralization occurs in a cliff horizon and detached slab which returned 2.30% copper, 3.9% zinc, 80.4 g/t silver and 2.44 g/t gold.
- ✓ Extensive airborne geophysical and soil geochemical targets occur across the property.

Koster Dam - Gold

- ✓ A new grassroots project staked by Cariboo Rose with a significant geochemical gold anomaly that has been identified but untested.
- ✓ Heavy mineral samples from several small drainages returned very high gold values with some up to 20 g/t Au.
- ✓ The claims fall within the Nechako Basin which also includes the Newton Hill occurrence located 90 kilometres to the west, the Blackwater Davidson occurrence located 220 kilometres to the northwest and the Blackdome Mine located 18 kilometres to the south.

CHG - Gold

- ✓ The CHG (Carbonate Hosted Gold) property is located near Clinton, BC.
- ✓ Historical reports from the Geological Survey of Canada report high-grade gold mineralized boulders in the glacial till in this area.
- ✓ The exploration target is modeled on a number of gold deposits including the Carlin Nevada, the Muddy Lake deposit in northern BC and the recent ATAC Resources discoveries in the Yukon.

Cowtrail - Copper and Gold

- ✓ The 4,600 hectare Cowtrail property is located 5 km southeast of Imperial Metals Mt. Polley mine.
- ✓ Cowtrail is a joint venture with Dajin Resources Corp. (65%) and Cariboo Rose (35%).

Pat - Copper and Gold

- ✓ The Pat property is 1,330 hectares in size and is located in the Cariboo region of south-central British Columbia.
- ✓ A large magnetic anomaly is present on the property which is similar in size, shape and intensity to that at the Mount Polley Mine.
